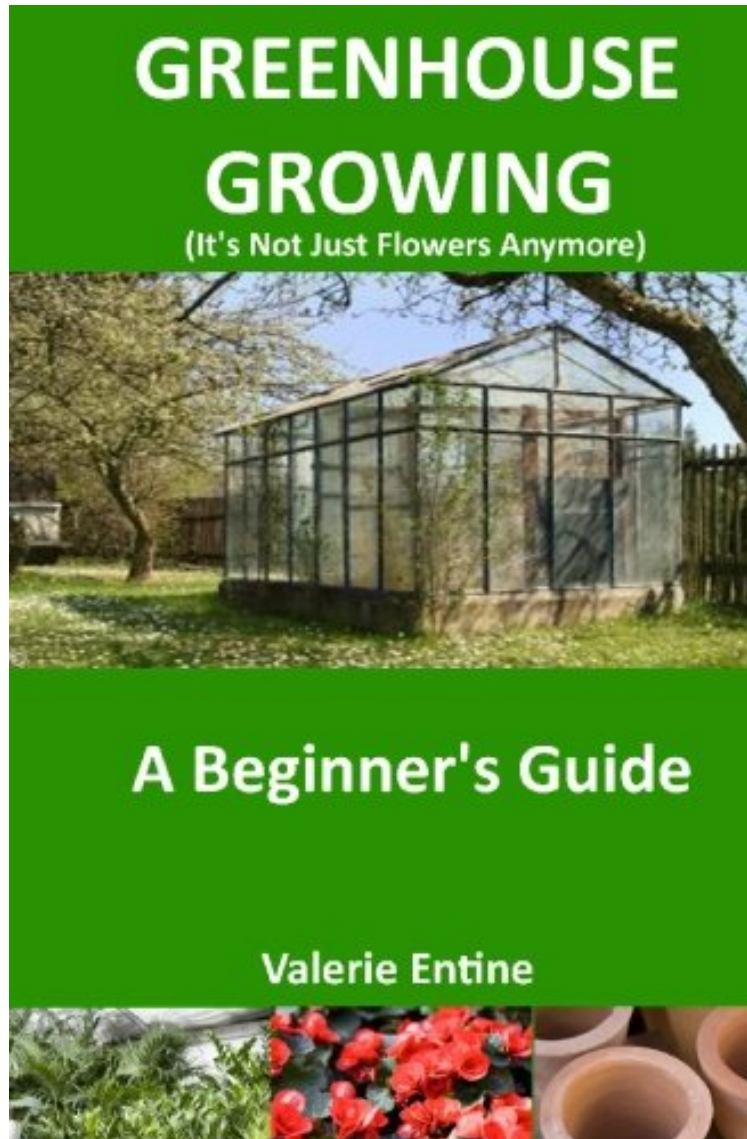

The font is 14 with extra spacing between paragraphs for added pages. Furthermore, the content is down right poor. This is an abomination.

Period. With that said, I will offer rationale as to why I feel this way by offering a review of the book to those interested. First, a physical description of the book. The book itself is about the size of a DVD or video game case, weighs about the same and is about the same thickness. It is a total of 54 pages. Each page has size 14 font (or something similar) and extra spaces between paragraphs as if it were written like a formal letter or memo. There are ZERO pictures or graphs. Although this is merely an educated guess, I would gander that if this were in 12 font and on a regular 8x12 piece of paper with standard 1.5" margins, it would equate to a total of 4-5 pages. This point leads me to my second complaint about the book, which is the lack of coherency or meaningful information provided in the content. The author attempts to offer information about greenhouses but only succeeds at making the reader feel as if they are wandering helplessly through a forest of worthless babbling that only leads to more questions about greenhouses. There is absolutely no detail in this book (which could be a result of 54 pages of large font and triple-spaced paragraphs). Let me offer an example of the ridiculous babble that is present in this book. On page 32, the author attempts to discuss a watering wand: "Some wands models extend to as long as 50 feet. They provide no hassle storage because of their self-coiling mechanism." This was an entire paragraph separated by the extraordinary spacing I mentioned previously. Seriously? I think the author simply took this two sentence statement straight off the box of a self-coiling hose. The very next paragraph goes like this: "Greenhouses constantly evolve in style and design. It follows then that tools and accessories will grow in number." What? I thought we were talking about watering wands? There is no transition, no flow, and no organization in this book. This one of a plethora of examples when the content of this book jumps suddenly and pointlessly from one thought to another. To put it frankly, this book is a violation to those that write and read in appropriate English. Save your money. If you don't care about money, then for goodness sake save your sanity, a few brain cells and a 20 minutes of your life.
