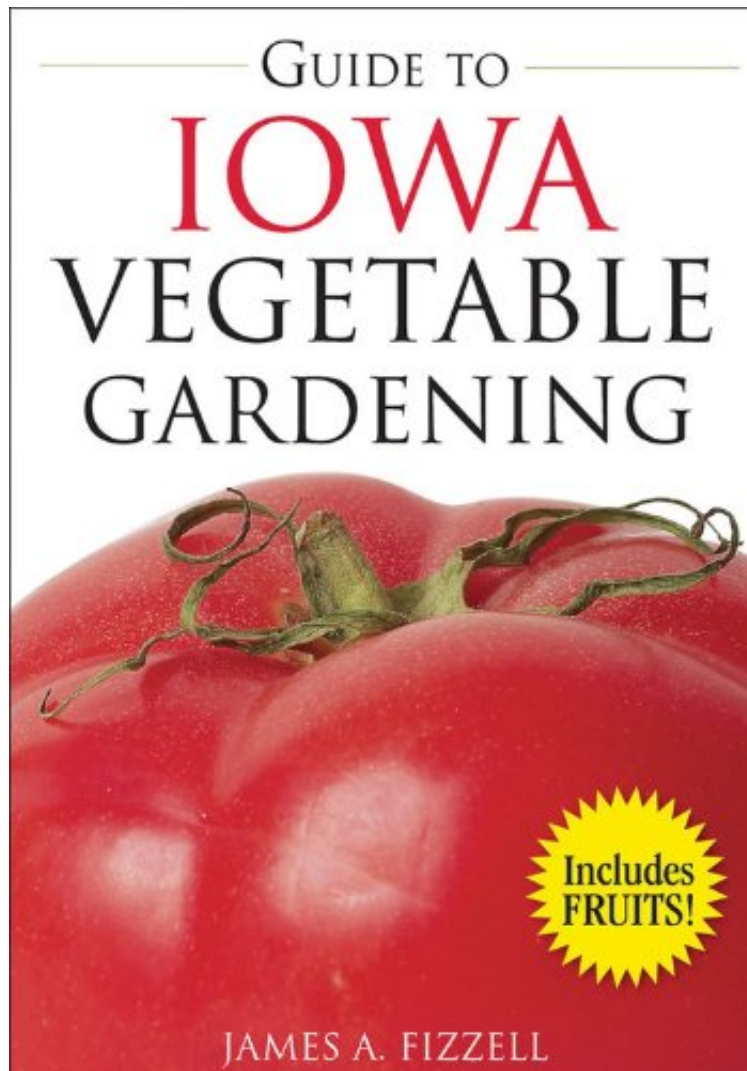

It contains no real images, but at least the lay-out is coherent and logical. Unfortunately, the author has been allowed to rant often in both uninteresting and completely irrelevant directions. Combined with the fact that hardly any names of hardy plants specifically fit for Iowa planting are mentioned, and that even a few plants are mentioned who will not grow in Iowa.. Helps make this one if the least

useful and enjoyable books in my gardening library. If you like explanations like "because everything worth doing, is worth doing well", then maybe this is the book for you. Though the author pays lip service to organic gardening, almost all his advice on caring for plants is on how to drown them in various types of poison. If one was to follow his advice, one could either move to a remote farm in Wisconsin (he actually suggests this), or one would spend at least as much on growing plants, as one would paying for them at the farmers market. Forget frugal, organic or simply useful for making a plant list. The bid is still out for a good book on Iowa gardening, I hope someday, somebody will write that book. Please include pictures!
