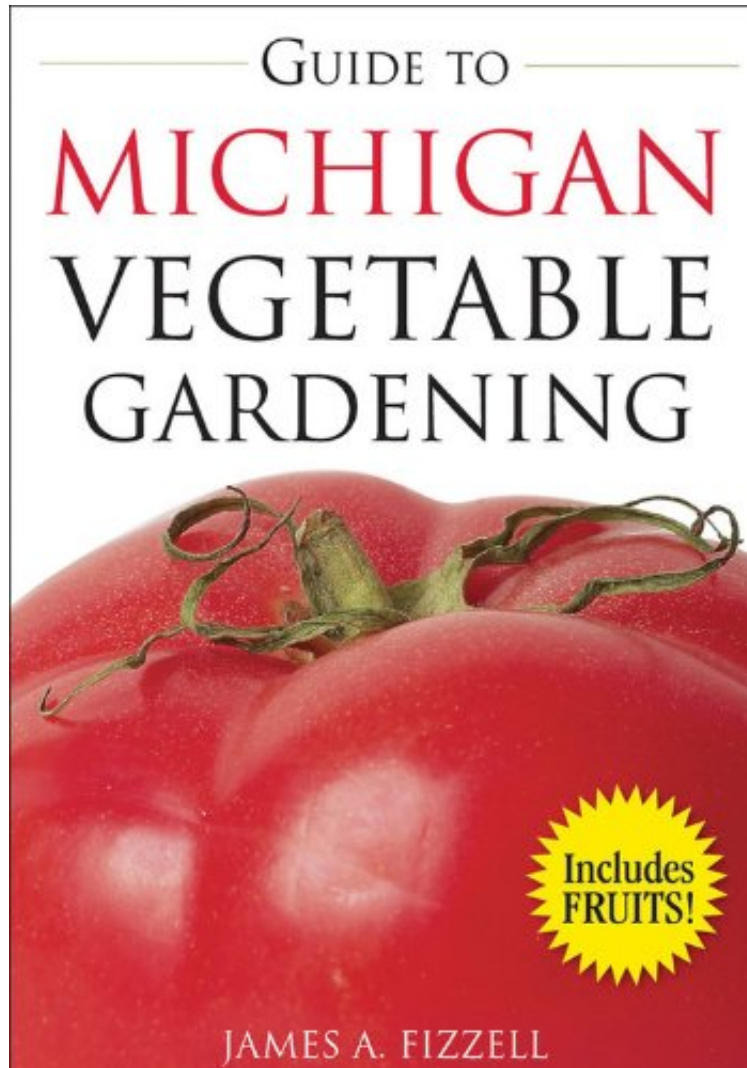

'Your State's Name Here' Vegetable Gardening. By Canadian I consider it cheap and deceptive to pretend to write a book specifically for one location whilst just writing a general book and plugging in any midwest state name. And it is not hard to tell. For instance, Mr. Fizzell (good name; book fizzelled for me!) says that "I have planted peas on Valentine's Day in a few unusual years". I have had a vegetable garden in southeast, southwest, and northern Michigan for 35 years, and I would love to know what little microclimate pocket in Michigan could have been planted with peas even in a "few" years. Also, you can tell which veg Mr. Fizzell is interested in because he recommends varieties for those. On the plus side, he gave me a good tip for a variety of sorrel which doesn't set seed, and he lists suppliers. although he missed St Lawrence Nursery as an excellent supplier of cold hardy fruit trees and he lists Canadian (Alberta!? Manitoba?!) seed sources. I have nothing against Canadian seed companies since I am a Canuck, but if you're gonna list them for Michigan growers, why not Stokes in Ontario?

This book offers advice on everything from starting your garden from seed, to planning your garden with helpful space saving techniques.
