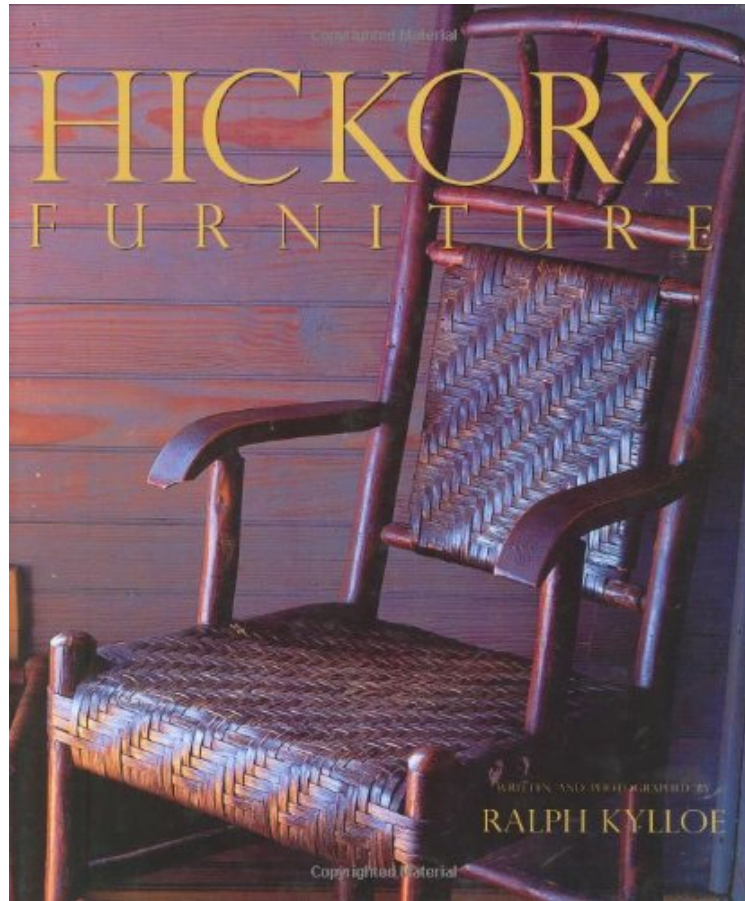

Indiana has records for several of the other hickory furniture firms but, unfortunately, the early records of the Old Hickory Chair Company, the largest and most prolific hickory company to have existed, were destroyed by 1960, when records were being transferred to microfilm. Fortunately, the Morgan County Recorder of Deeds has maintained some files that shed light on the Old Hickory Chair Company.
