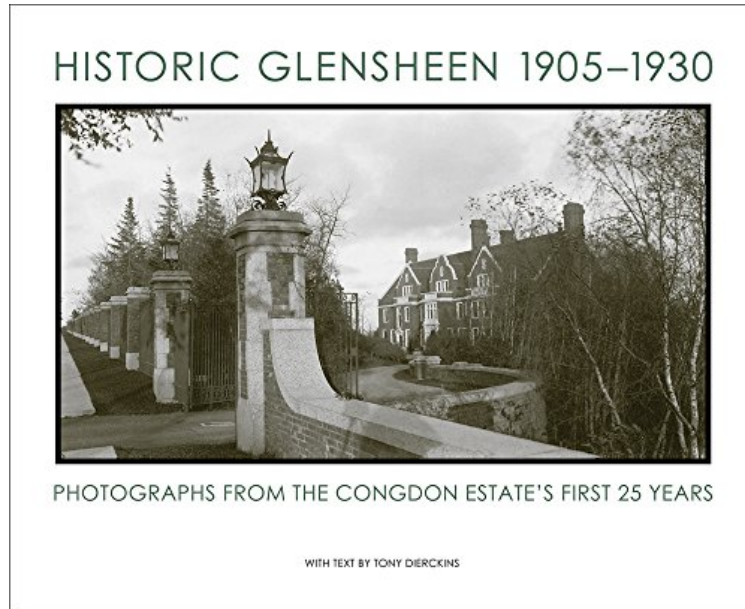

Others show Glensheen in the 1920s, after Chester s death, when Clara Congdon allowed much of the grounds to grow wild.
