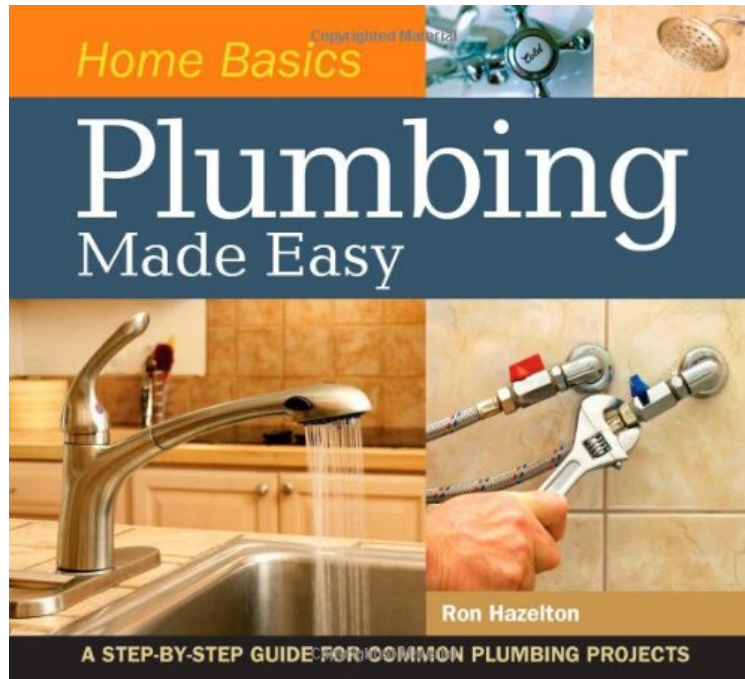

The section on tankless water heaters is two pages. It states to do research on which ones to buy, go to store and buy it then watch
