This took my simple graph and made it so impressive. It also revealed the major errors in my original plans. It explains things like stairs and such. I realize that I had too many steps and they took up much more space than necessary. Also things like the thickness of the walls, its hard to take that into account on paper. It also gives ideas for small bathrooms and closet space. It talks about the minimum width you need for hallways. I would recommend this to anyone who is ocd...lol. the only thing annoying is it has many kitchen tables, several are the same exact size which doesn't make sense. Why would I have two kitchen table of the same size. But only one queen size bed when most people have at least 2 bedrooms with queen size beds. But this is a very minor detail.
