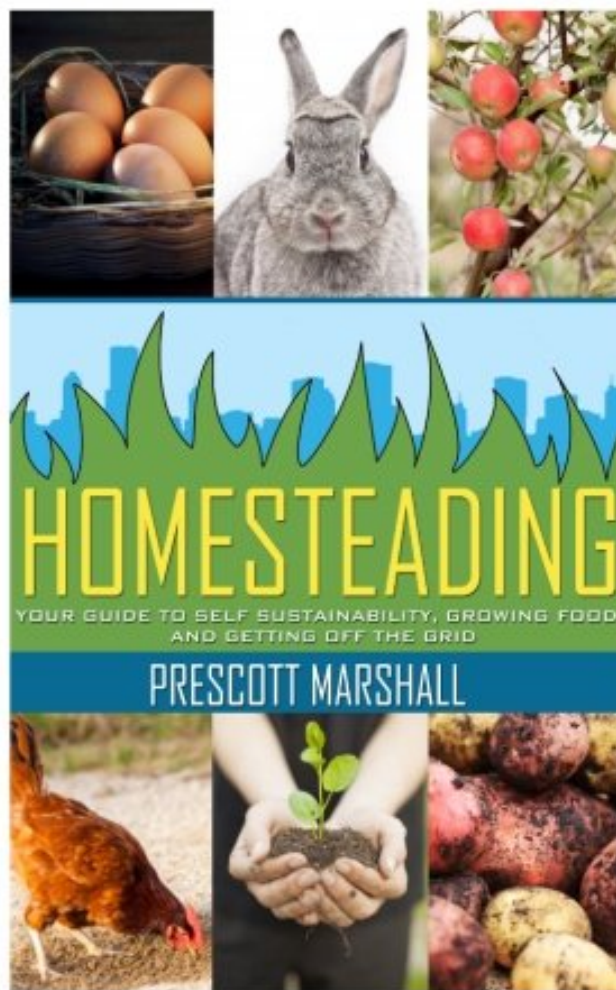

The recipes looked interesting, but, I'm not sure why those recipes were included in an introductory discussion of homesteading.
